Time for Rights

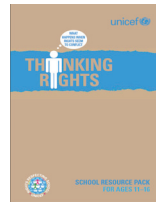

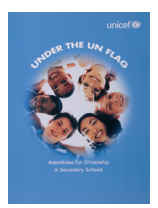
