Session Plan (45 mins)

Do all young people have enough say in their rights?



Timing	Activity	Resources
2-4 minutes	Starter Question : Ask students to discuss in pairs whether they think the young people are safe or not, and why. Reveal the images.	PPT slide 2
2-3 minutes	Reveal the topic, Learning Objectives, Keywords and Issues to discuss : Reveal the topic, LOs, Keywords and Issues to Discuss.	PPT slides 3-4
5-10 minutes	Why are we learning about this? UNICEF campaign. Watch the video and make notes on what parents think is important for children. Introduce the rights of the child. Look at the 4 areas and ask students to list what rights they think they should have under each heading. Reveal the rights.	PPT slides 5-7
3 minutes	Why are we talking about this cont: As a class read the 3 points about children's rights – emphasis the key word infringement.	PPT slide 8
10-15 minutes	Should adults make decisions for you? Introduce the understanding that adults have responsibility for children's rights, ask students to carry out the role play to emphasise how this can sometimes be very tricky! How old do you have to be? In pairs ask students to look at the different laws and see if you can decide how old you have to be, reveal the answers on slide 13. Discuss these as a class.	PPT slides 9-12
10-15 minutes	Are you taken seriously enough? As a class discuss whether adults take your views seriously or not, and if not what can be done to change this. Share ideas, you could even consider as a school how you could improve how well students are listened to, or what channels are in place to support their views. Look at the online safety rights young people have – do students think these are enough to protect them? Now watch the video of Malala Yousafazi and pick out which right she is standing up for. Then move to the activity and share class ideas.	PPT slides 14-17
