## Session Plan KS2 (30-60 minutes)

## Do rich people give enough money to charity?



Timing	Activity	Resources
N/A	Feedback: Allow pupils time to read the feedback on the Royal Wedding.	PPT slide 2
2 minutes	<b>Introduce this week's topic and learning journey.</b> Explain that VotesforSchools are working with UNICEF UK this week.	PPT slides 3-4
5-10 minutes	It's not all about the money: Ask pupils in pairs to brainstorm all the ways they can be charitable, making notes on a whiteboard. They can read the scenarios and watch the video on slides 6-8 for inspiration. Share their ideas and compare them with the different ideas on slide 9. Did they get them all? Have they done any of these before?	PPT slides 5-9
5-10 minutes	<b>Why are we talking about this?</b> Explain that on 10 <sup>th</sup> June, celebrities are taking part in Soccer Aid to raise money for a children's charity, UNICEF UK. They can watch the video to learn more about this and also watch the video of Raheema, a refugee from Myanmar, to understand how the money will help children in need.	PPT slide 11
7-15 minutes	If I were a millionaire: Individually, ask pupils to budget what they would spend £100 million on. What would they give away to others and what would they keep for themselves? Use the images and prompt questions on slide 14 to help. Then, share how much some rich celebrities give to charity on slide 15. What are their thoughts?	PPT slides 13-15
7-15 minutes	How can people be more giving? This is a chance for pupils to explore first, how charitable different countries are looking at a map. Point out that Myanmar is a poor country but more charitable than the UK which is considered a rich country. Then on slide 18, watch the video of kind acts to give pupils some inspiration for writing tips about how to be more charitable. They can make notes if they like. End with the opportunity for pupils to work in small groups to come up with five tips that everyone could follow to be more charitable. They can create posters if they like!	PPT slides 17-19
N/A	Call to Action: A chance to take learning outside of the lesson (see below)	PPT slide 21
5 minutes	<b>Vote:</b> Give pupils time to reflect on the statistics and points that back up each viewpoint. Then they can vote! Remember if your pupils don't vote online but you want to share their comments, email them to us.	PPT slides 23-24
