Session Plan (45 mins)

Do rich people give enough money to charity?



Timing	Activity	Resources
N/A	Feedback: Share the feedback with your students.	PPT slide 2
3 minutes	Starter: Introduce the topic by asking students what they would do if they won the lottery and suddenly became rich.	PPT slide 3
2-3 minutes	Reveal the topic, Learning Objectives, Keywords and Issues to discuss : Reveal the topic, LOs, Keywords and Issues to Discuss. Tell your students that we are working with UNICEF UK this week.	PPT slides 4-6
6 minutes	If you were rich As a starting point to this debate ask students how they would budget if they earned £10 million per year. In pairs they should share their ideas. As a class find out how much the students would give to charity.	PPT slide 7
6 minutes	How much do rich people give? On the slide look at some famous people and how much they have given to charity. On the next slide discuss as a group the different ways we can make a difference, is making a difference just about money? Reveal the other ways you can 'give'.	PPT slide 9-10
8 minutes	Are you considered rich? As a starting point look at the table and ask students who they consider rich. Reveal the information on the next slide about earnings and the income gap. Watch the video on how wealth is spread to give students an understanding of how this looks globally. Discuss whether they think Britain is a rich country and whether rich countries should help those who need it more.	PPT slides 12-13
10 minutes	Could rich people end poverty? Look at the headline and discuss as a class whether based on that information if they think rich people should end poverty. On the next slide is a chance to explore how much is needed and whether the richest people have enough between them to end poverty. The answer is yes! See teachers notes under the slide to show how this is worked out.	PPT slides 15-16
10 minutes	Why are we talking about this? Introduce to students Soccer Aid. Watch the 2 videos, firstly to learn more about Soccer Aid and who is taking part and secondly the video of Sebenele who has benefitted from the money raised by UNICEF UK.	PPT slide 18
N/A	Call to Action: Please see below for ways the students can really engage in this debate and get involved in Soccer Aid 2018.	PPT slide 20
1 minute	Really encourage students to reflect on this topic as it is hard hitting, then when they are ready they can vote.	PPT Slides 21-22
