## CHECKLIST FOR GOLD: RIGHTS RESPECTING



This checklist provides you with a quick overview of the actions you need to take to prepare to be accredited at the final stage of the Rights Respecting Schools Award, Gold: Rights Respecting.

To progress towards Gold: Rights Respecting, your school will need to build on what you have achieved at Silver: Rights Aware. However, the efforts to embed child rights in the school will be deeper and wider so that the values and principles of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child are fully embedded into the whole school's practice.

1	Celebrate achieving Silver: Rights Aware	
	Inform the whole school community. You can display your Silver logo	
	and certificate, hold an event or assembly, and send out a letter to	
	parents and carers to let them know. Think about sharing your report	
0	with your Local Authority and other external partners.	
2	Review your Steering Group	
	Are you effectively embedding rights across the school and into the	
	community? The Steering Group should know that the Gold Outcome	
	Descriptors are different from the Silver Outcome Descriptors.	
3	Ensure the Award is an ongoing item at staff, council and	
	governor meetings	
	Adults should know that the Gold Outcome Descriptors are different	
	from the Silver Outcome Descriptors. How are you going to deepen	
	what it means to teach and learn <b>ABOUT</b> rights, <b>THROUGH</b> rights	
	and <b>FOR</b> rights at Gold? Find out more in the Teaching and Learning	
	Toolbox in the resources section on our website.	
4	Plan your RRSA journey to Gold with your Steering Group	
	Prioritise your actions using the Action Plan for Gold, taking into	
	account recommendations from your Silver accreditation visit report.	
5	Identify evidence to meet the Gold Outcome Descriptors	
	Evidence might include planning, policies, pupils' work and	
	assemblies so that you have an overview of the learning that is taking	
	place and its impact. Keep the Gold Outcome Descriptors in mind.	
	Begin to compile your evidence portfolio required for your Gold visit.

6	Measure your impact (optional)	
	You might find it useful to carry out the pupil questionnaires and staff	
	questionnaires so that you have an overview of the staff and pupils'	
	current knowledge and understanding of children's rights and the UN	
	Convention on the Rights of the Child. This is no longer a	
	requirement, but you may wish to complete these if you have	
	previously.	
	You might find it helpful to transfer the data to the School	
	Questionnaire Summary. Find the School Questionnaire Summary	
	spreadsheet here.	

	Measuring your progress using our pupil and staff questionnaires can be invaluable in showing you the impact that embedding children's rights is having. It can also be used within the evidence that you present at Gold.
7	Complete the School Evaluation: Gold form
	Complete the School Evaluation: Gold form to check you are ready for your accreditation visit. Identify:
	<ul> <li>How has the outcome been achieved?</li> <li>What difference has been made?</li> <li>What evidence do you have?</li> </ul>
	The form is to be completed by senior leaders. You may include feedback from staff and pupil questionnaires, reports from your school inspection body, comments from parents, etc.
	Once you have done this you are ready for the Gold: Rights Respecting Accreditation visit. Complete the <u>Gold Accreditation</u> <u>Booking Form</u> and send to your Professional Advisor.
