



Rights Around the World Display Instructions

As a group, class or school you can build your own map of the stories, rights and sustainable development goals that we have explored together each month.

On the final slide of the pack, titled take your learning out into the world, you will find prompts that can be used to further the learning, and which can be added to your display.

Examples might be:

- A short piece of writing about the project or story featured that month.
- A picture of your group taking an action based on the topic.
- An art idea based on learning from the topic.

Each month's pack will have suggested activities, but you are welcome to respond and add to the wall display in a way that feels most appropriate for your group.

You might want to add the articles that are most relevant to the learning that has taken place that month or the Sustainable Development Goal icons.

To create your display, you will need:

- A visual of the world. We recommend using our world map print outs which can be found on the Rights Around the World page on the RRSA website. Any existing world map that you have could be used as well.
- The Rights Around the World display title.
- Display card print outs which you can use to put learners written or visual reflections on.
- Location pin print outs and string.
