

Day for Change 2017 SURVEY PRIZE DRAW: TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The Prize Draw

1. By entering this Prize Draw, you agree to be bound by these terms and conditions.
2. The Prize Draw is arranged by United Kingdom Committee for UNICEF (UUK). Registered charity 1072612 (England and Wales) and SC043677 (Scotland). Registered company limited by guarantee 3663181 (England and Wales). Registered office: 30a Great Sutton Street, London EC1V 0DU.
3. All UK residents are eligible to enter, excluding employees of UUK, their families and any party associated with administration of this prize draw.
4. Entrants must be 18 years of age or over. Any person found to be under 18 years of age automatically forfeits their right to any prize.
5. All Day for Change registrants who complete the post-event survey and provide their contact email address (Entrants) will be entered into this prize draw at no additional cost.
6. UUK will calculate whether or not entrants have completed the post event survey by midnight on the closing date referred to in paragraph 8 of these terms and conditions.
7. No responsibility can be accepted for entries lost, delayed, misdirected, damaged or undelivered. UUK shall not be responsible for technical errors in internet access or otherwise preventing entry to the prize draw.
8. The opening date for entries is 8am on 7th July 2017 and the closing date is 5pm on 31st July 2017. Any entries received after this time will not be eligible for the prize draw.
9. The winner will be chosen by a random selection computer process from the eligible Entrants who have been entered into the prize draw.

The winner

10. There will be one winner of the competition for the prize available.

11. The winner will be notified by email (using the details provided by registrants at entry) within 21 days of the closing date and the prize will be posted to the address given by the winner. If the prize is returned for any reason the prize will be forfeited and UUK will be entitled to select another winner in accordance with the processes described in these terms and conditions.

12. UUK's decision is final. No correspondence will be entered into.

Survey prize draw

13. The prize is a selection of 2 signed books by children's authors Malorie Blackman and Robin Stevens. There is no cash alternative and the prize is non-transferable, non-negotiable and non-refundable.

14. UUK retains the right to substitute the prize with another prize of similar value in the event the original prize offered is not available.
