### Fall back

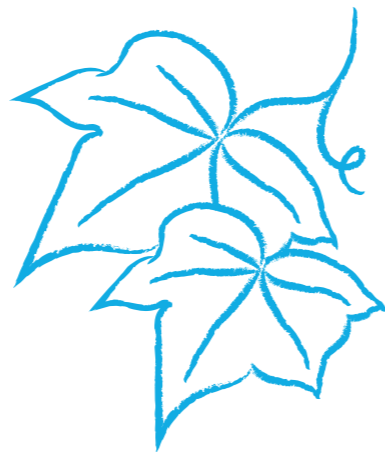
