

EASTER APPEAL FOR CHILDREN IN DANGER

RAHEEMA'S JOURNEY TO A SAFE PLACE

Ten-year-old Raheema* and her family were forced to flee from Myanmar to Bangladesh. Their perilous journey of more than a week on foot through dangerous terrain, is something no child should have to endure. Raheema's sisters, brothers, mother and aunt came with her, but her father was left behind. They don't know what has happened to him.

Many refugee children suffer emotional trauma because of what they have witnessed, their upheaval from home and loved ones, and their often terrifying experiences on the journey.

Arriving in Bangladesh with nothing but the clothes they were wearing, Raheema's family were taken to a refugee camp at Cox's Bazar.

Raheema now goes to a Unicef-funded Child Friendly Space at the camp. In this safe space, Raheema gets clean water and food, as well as the chance to learn, play and receive care and support.

Unicef has been working tirelessly to provide psychosocial support for over 135,000 Rohingya children at Child Friendly Spaces in camps in Bangladesh. Over 80,000 children are also attending temporary learning centres that Unicef supports in the camps.
