

## QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR PROSPECTIVE PARLIAMENTARY CANDIDATES

Unicef UK's work covers a broad range of issues, and there are many ways your Prospective Parliamentary Candidates (PPCs) can support children's rights in the UK and internationally.

## HOW CANDIDATES CAN PROTECT & UPHOLD THE RIGHTS OF CHILDREN:

Unicef UK is calling on all the major political parties to commit to protecting the rights of the world's most vulnerable children. Ask them to do this by:

- Celebrating the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child on World Children's Day (Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> November) by joining <u>#TeamChildren</u> taking a photo with our sign and sharing on social media alongside their support for child rights.
- Reaffirming the UK's commitment to supporting an independent Department for International Development and spending 0.7% of national income on aid which supports vaccinations, improved nutrition and Universal Health Coverage.
- Committing to meet with Unicef UK Government Relations Team throughout the next Parliament (if elected) to live up to their pledge for <u>#TeamChildren</u>

Below we've suggested some questions that relate to Unicef UK's key priorities:

If elected, what steps will you take to protect the health of every child around the world?

- In 2017, 5.3m children died from a preventable cause before they reached their fifth birthday. Further coordination and investment is needed to improve immunisation rates, tackle malnutrition and provide basic healthcare access. What action would you take to ensure the UK leads the world in ending preventable child deaths?
- Spending UK Aid on alleviating poverty and tackling disease makes me proud of our country. Will you commit to protecting the 0.7% aid budget target and ensuring child health remains a DFID's priority and an essential component of UK Aid?

If elected, what steps will you take to protect the health of every child here in the UK?

- I'm worried about air pollution levels and the impact toxic air has on children's health. How do you feel about the environment and current air quality standards? What do you think the Government could to do support measures which protect children?
- Unicef UK analysis shows that 1 in 3 children are living in areas of the UK with unsafe levels of Particulate Matter - these tiny particles can get into their lungs and cause long-lasting health problems. Would you support the introduction of targets which would encourage the Government, businesses, local authorities to increase attention and resource to tackle toxic air?

If elected, what steps will you take to promote and protect the rights of refugee and migrant children?

I think it's important to protect refugee children from trafficking and exploitation by reuniting them with family here in the UK. Would you support rule changes that would ensure refugee children can reach safety in the UK and be reunited with their families here?

Throughout the General Election and if elected, what action will you take to listen to children and young people who live in the area?

- I believe children should be engaged in decisions and matters that affect them. How will you support the active participation of children and young people if you are elected as our MP?
- I would like to see all candidates ensure local children and young people consulted as part of the General Election. Have you been talking to children and young people about their concerns and priorities for our community? If not, how would you encourage them to?
